

NorthWoods Überländer Camping Registration Policy

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all campers are aware of the rules and regulations that govern camping. This policy is in place to protect the safety and enjoyment of all campers, as well as to protect the environment.

Registration

All campers must register in advance of their arrival. Registration can be done online. When registering, campers will be required to provide their name, address, contact information, and the number of people in their party. Campers will also be required to pay a camping fee.

Check-in, Check-out

Campsite check-in starts at 3pm on Friday, June 9 and checkout is by 4pm on Sunday, June 11. Remove all the trash from your campsite upon departure.

Campsite Selection

Campsites are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Campers are not guaranteed a specific campsite.

Campsite Amenities

Port-o-Potties are available throughout the camp area. Do not use the "great outdoors" as your toilet. Campers are responsible for providing their own sleeping gear, food, water, and other supplies. Shower houses are not available at this camping area, BYO to your campsite. Dumpsters are available.

Campsite Rules

Campers are expected to follow all campground rules:

- Keep your campsite clean and free of trash.
- Do not leave food or garbage unattended.
- **Never store food in the tent. The best place to store food is in a cooler in the car. Be mindful of the northwoods wildlife—there are bears, coyotes, and wolves in the area. They will snatch anything that is left out.**
- Do not feed the wildlife.
- Respect your neighbors.
- Quiet hours are 10pm-7am.
- Do not build fires outside of above ground pits (Solo stove).
- Do not litter.
- Do not damage any property.
- Keep the port-o-potties clean

Pet Policy

Pets are allowed at the campground, but they must be kept on a leash **at all times**. Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Pets are also not allowed anywhere on the event grounds, including the course, start/finish line area, Great Hall, food, and spectator areas.

Fire Policy

Fires are allowed in above ground fire pits (Solo stove). Fires must be attended at all times and extinguished completely before leaving the campsite.

Alcohol Policy

Alcohol is allowed at the campground, but it must be consumed responsibly. Remember, this is a family event, not a Frat party..

Refund Policy

Campsite reservations can be canceled up to midnight June 3, 2023 for a full refund. Cancellations made June 4 and June 9, 2023 will not be refunded.

Damage Policy

Campers are responsible for any damage they cause to the campground or its facilities. Damages will be billed to the camper's credit card.

Liability

The campground assumes no liability for any personal injury, property damage, or other loss that may occur while on the campground. Campers agree to hold the campground harmless for any such losses.

By registering for a campsite at our facility, you agree to abide by all of the rules and regulations set forth in this policy.
